**United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea
concluded at Montego Bay, Jamaica
on 10 December 1982**

Receipt of the partial submission made by Mexico
to the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf

The Secretary General of the United Nations communicates the following:

On 13 December 2007, Mexico submitted to the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf, in accordance with Article 76, paragraph 8, of the Convention, information on the limits of the continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles from the baselines from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured in respect of the western polygon in the Gulf of Mexico.

It is noted that the Convention entered into force for Mexico on 16 November 1994.

In accordance with the Rules of Procedure of the Commission, the present communication is circulated to all Member States of the United Nations, as well as States Parties to the Convention, in order to make public the executive summary of the submission, including all charts and coordinates contained in that summary. The executive summary of the submission is available through the website of the Division of Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, at www.un.org/Depts/los.

The consideration of the partial submission of Mexico shall be included in the provisional agenda of the twenty-first session of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf, to be held in New York from 17 March to 18 April 2008.

Upon completion of the consideration of the submission, the Commission shall make recommendations pursuant to article 76 of the Convention.
