issues in the longer term. We need to ensure our work is fully coordinated, in line with a vision that sees all sides to the problem, rather than working in our silos of narrow expertise, she stressed.

The Committee was also briefed on progress in the work of the Counter-eight Working Groups, which have continued their work despite the outbreak of COVID-19, and its Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Platform, which has been joined by 112 Member States and visited already over 25,000 since its launch in March 2020.

Launched in December 2018 as part of Secretary-

counter-terrorism architecture, the Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact is one of the largest coordination frameworks across the three pillars of work of the United Nations: peace and security, sustainable development, human rights and humanitarian affairs. The 43_{rd} and most recent signatory to the Counter-Terrorism Compact, the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research, joined in February 2020.
