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Regarding draft Article 18 pr**os**ed by the Special Rapporteur, Australia invites the Commission to further elaborate and clarify the rationale for the new draft article.

In this regard, Australia notes the existing without prejudice clause in draft article 1. The commentary to that distarticle makes clear that immunities enjoyed before international criminal tribunals remain outside the scope of the draft articles.

Further, the commentary also provides that none of the rules that govern immunity before such tribunals are to before by the content of the draft articles.

In relation to draft article 17, Australia invites the Commission to clarify how the article would operate in practice, particularly in light of language in draft article 17 indicating that Statesnay suggets\_referral of a dispute to arbitration or to the International Court of Justice.

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
