Governments, the UN system and other stakeholders have been invited to contribute inputs to update the concept papers of the eight interactive dialogues of the 2022 UN Ocean Conference, to be held from 27 June to 1 July in Lisbon. Taking into account the evolving landscape and new challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, inputs are particularly sought regarding latest COVID 19-related data and analysis in the status and trends, challenges and opportunities, possible areas for new partnerships as well as recommendations on advancing implementation of Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 14.

In this regard, a global online stakeholder consultation has been set up to gather inputs from NGOs, civil society organizations, academic institutions, the scientific community, the private sector, philanthropic organizations and other actors. The deadline for submissions is 21 February 2022.

The themes of the eight interactive dialogues of the 2022 UN Ocean Conference are:

- 1) Addressing marine pollution;
- 2) Managing, protecting, conserving and restoring marine and coastal ecosystems;
 3) Minimizing and addressing ocean acidification, deoxygenation and ocean warming;
- 4) Making fisheries sustainable and providing access for small-scale artisanal fishers to marine resources and markets;
- 5) <u>Promoting and strengthening sustainable ocean-based economies, in particular for small island developing States and least developed countries;</u>
- 6) Increasing scientific knowledge and developing research capacity and transfer of marine technology;
- 7) Enhancing the conservation and sustainable use of oceans and their resources by implementing international law, as reflected in the United Nations Con96 0.30 m and sustainable useo and s2
